

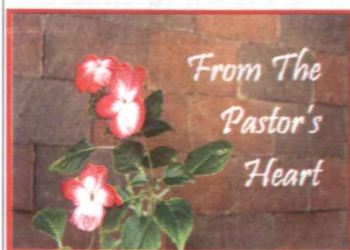

“Are We Loosing Our Children?”

“From James, a servant of God and of our Lord Jesus Christ. Greetings to the twelve tribes scattered all over the world. 2 My friends, be glad, **even if you have a lot of trouble**. 3 You know that **you learn to endure by having your faith tested**. 4 But **you must learn to endure everything**, so that **you will be completely mature** and not lacking in anything.” - **James 1:1-4** (Contemporary English Version)

Show me a person who has had a lot of trouble and doesn't complain... Show me a person who has been taken advantage of or a person who has been persecuted for what they believe... Show me a person who has been gossiped about, talked down to, and even belittled publically but doesn't retaliate... Show me a person who prays and keeps their mouth shut while others rant about their 'opinions...' Show me a person who gives up their way of doing things so that another can do it their way, and I'll show you a mature person who can handle the larger things of God because they have proven themselves worthy to handle the 'little' troubles/things.

“Anyone who can be trusted in little matters can also be trusted in important matters. But anyone who is dishonest in little matters will be dishonest in important matters.”
- **Luke 16:10**

Are we losing our children? Are we spending too much time complaining about and focusing on the troubles/things of this world/life to that point that we are forgetting about our children? Recipe of the Month Zesty Cheeseburger Mac Casserole

Ingredients:

- 1 pkg. (16 oz.) frozen vegetable blend (broccoli, carrots, cauliflower) (3 cups)
- 1 pkg. (14 oz.) KRAFT Deluxe Macaroni & Cheese Dinner Made With 2% Milk Cheese
- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup fat-free milk
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup KRAFT Lite Zesty Italian Dressing
- 1 lb. extra-lean ground beef, cooked, drained
- 1 cup KRAFT 2% Milk Shredded Sharp Cheddar Cheese, divided

Directions:

HEAT oven to 375°F.

PLACE frozen vegetables in colander in sink. Cook Macaroni as directed on package. Pour cooked macaroni over vegetables in colander to drain and quickly thaw vegetables.

RETURN macaroni and vegetables to same saucepan. Add Cheese Sauce, milk and dressing; mix well. Add cooked meat and $\frac{1}{2}$ cup cheddar cheese; mix well. Spoon into 2-qt. casserole; cover.

BAKE 35 min. or until heated through. Top with remaining cheddar; bake, uncovered, 3 to 4 min. or until cheese is melted.

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Peace I leave with you, My peace I give unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.—John 14:27

There's nothing tougher than feeling the pressure of sin, sickness, lack or grief, and yet refusing to let it dominate you. There's nothing tougher than standing up at those times and saying, "No! “Depend On God’s Unmerited Favor, Not Favoritism”



And the patriarchs, becoming envious, sold Joseph into Egypt. But God was with him and delivered him out of all his troubles, and gave him favor and wisdom in the presence of Pharaoh, king of Egypt; and he made him governor over Egypt and all his house.
-Acts 7:9-10

There is a significant difference between **God’s unmerited favor** and **favoritism**. God’s unmerited favor is based entirely on Jesus’ merit, and we received it through His finished work at the cross. We did nothing to deserve His favor. It is completely unmerited. Favoritism, however, stinks of self-effort. Individuals who rely on favoritism for promotion resort to apple-polishing, office politics, manipulative tactics, backstabbing and all kinds of compromises just to get what they want.

God has a higher and better way for you. It hurts Him to see His precious children groveling like sycophants just to get ahead in life. If a door closes, so be it! Believe with full confidence that God has a better way for you. You don’t have to depend on favoritism to succeed when you have God’s unmerited favor!

That was how Joseph operated. He depended on the Lord for his success. When Potiphar’s wife kept trying to seduce him to sleep with her, Joseph stood his ground on the firm foundation of God’s unmerited favor. He didn’t go for favoritism by doing what his boss’ wife wanted.

Beloved, like Joseph, know and rejoice that it is the Lord who is the source of your blessings and success. You don’t have to resort to trying to win the favor of significant people in your life. It is the Lord’s favor on you that sets you up for recognition, promotion and increase!

“Practice Jesus’ Presence and ‘Smell’ Like Him”

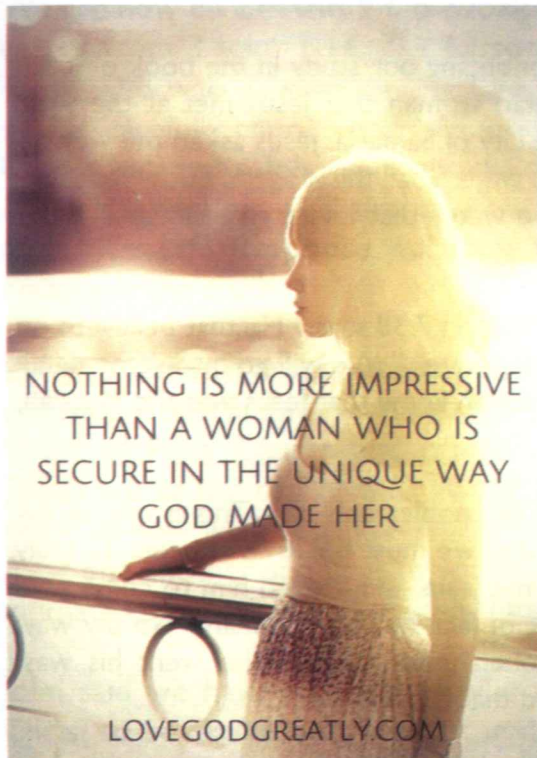
Now when they saw the boldness of Peter and John, and perceived that they were uneducated and untrained men; they marveled, and they realized that they had been with Jesus. -Acts 4:13

Have you ever been in a room filled with cigarette smoke? Perhaps you were in a small restaurant and there were a number of people puffing away. The whole place was smoky and your hair and clothes soon began to smell of smoke. And even after you left the restaurant, you still smelled of smoke!

Children's Sunday School

Ages 6-11

For the month of May, the children's Sunday School class will be continuing our study in the book of John. We will begin in John chapter 4 studying the story of the Samaritan woman that Jesus met at the well. When Jesus was on His journey into Galilee, He passed through the city of Samaria. Jesus asked the woman at the well for a drink, and said to her, "Whosoever drinketh of this water shall thirst again: But whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life."

This promise was the foreshadowing of the coming of the Holy Spirit. John 7:38 says, "He that believeth on me, as the scripture hath said, out of his belly shall flow rivers of living water." We will go into some detail of this great promise. In addition, we will read how the Samaritan woman knew that Jesus was the Messiah, and how she spread the good news to her people.

In the second half of May, we will read the story of the healing of the nobleman's son. This is one of my favorite stories of healing in the Word. This story by itself proves that we must **BELIEVE** in order to truly **RECEIVE**. In this story, a man's son was at the point of death. He met Jesus and begged him to come save his son. Jesus never even saw or laid hands on the son. As a matter of fact, he told the man, "Go thy way; thy son liveth." The man **believed** the word that Jesus had spoken unto him, and he went his way. Hallelujah! Before the man even made it home, his servants reported that his son liveth!!

In order to truly **RECEIVE**, we must **BELIEVE**. It was the simple act of believing Jesus' word, and not any other action that saved his son. We must never limit God or His Word. It will not return void.

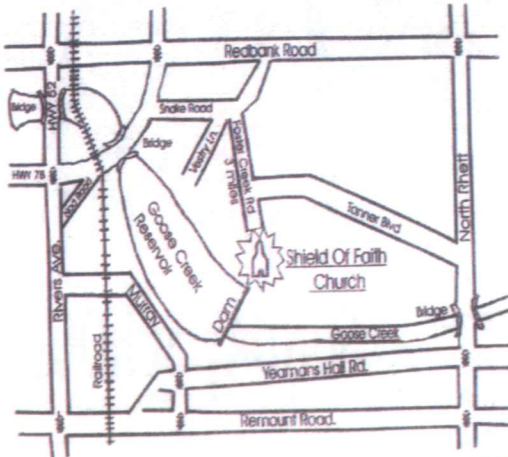
